- Food and farming are central to our national identity and together they are a bedrock of our economy, generating over £100 billion a year and employing 1 in 8 people.
- Food and drink is the UK's largest manufacturing sector. It contributed £26.9 billion to the UK economy in 2014 and employs around 400,000 people.

## **UK Performance**

- Although the UK has some world-class farmers, the industry as a whole is lagging behind other countries.
- The UK agriculture sector has improved its productivity by **3.1% per year**. Annual growth is 6% in the Netherlands, 5.3% in France and 4.6% in Italy.

## UK Strategy for Agricultural Technologies

Published in July 2013, key actions include:

- Improve translation of research into practise.
- £80m of government funding for Centres for Agricultural Innovation.
- £70m for "catalyst projects"
- Provide stronger leadership across the agri-food sector
- Build a stronger **skills** base.
- Increase UK exports and inward investment performance

#### **Farm-Level Innovation**

 Farm Business Survey (FBS) data shows that around a quarter of surveyed livestock businesses in England had introduced some form of new or innovative practice in 2015. For cropping businesses, the equivalent number was a third in 2014.

## Brexit

The EU Exit Programme is made up of eight work streams, with a programme office to support the Programme. The work streams are:

- 1. Fisheries
- 2. Animal and plant health
- 3. Environmental strategy
- 4. Environmental regulations and markets
- 5. Farming and horticulture and land use
- 6. Trade
- 7. UK framework
- 8. Relationship with EU and continuing EU business

We can think creatively about our options drawing from best practice around the world to deliver the best combination of outcomes for the sector, the environment, the consumer and the taxpayer. Major areas for concentration will be: productivity; trade and market access and access to labour.
