UK CEREALS



Exists in hard and soft forms and is milled to provide flours for a wide range of baked products. Also used for animal feed and starch/gluten production.



Barley Hordeum vulgare

Exists as 2-row and 6-row forms. Principally used for malting or animal feed.

Rye Secale cereale

Small amounts are grown in the UK. Rye flour is used in breadmaking and crispbreads, often combined with wheat flour. Tends to produce dark and dense loaves with a distinctive flavour.



Oats/Naked oats Avena sativa

The cultivated oat is used for breakfast cereals (incl porridge), muesli bars etc. Also fed to racehorses.

The naked oat is a variant of Avena sativa without the hard seed coat. Uses are similar to husked oats. Useful in poultry rations.



HGCA

Triticale x-Triticosecale species

A man-made cereal, resulting from a cross between wheat and rye. Not widely grown in the UK and used mostly in animal feed.



Durum Triticum durum

Very hard grain with a yellow endosperm, grown on a very limited scale in the UK. It is used to produce pasta.



HGCA identifying grain defects and impurities in grain
